Countable and uncountable nouns

Using singular and plural nouns

Some nouns do not have a plural form. These are called uncountable nouns.

You can use words like a packet of ,a tin of with some uncountable nouns.

Examples:

There is some ice.

How much rice is there?

There is some water.

How much water is there?

There is some chicken.

How much chicken is there? **Countable nouns** Most nouns are countable in English: Where is my book? I need a holiday! Add - s to make a plural: I love history books. We have two holidays every year. Some words ending in – ss, -s, -ch, sh, - x need –es to make the plural: Classes, buses, watches, dishes, boxes Some nouns are different in the plural: Man = men Woman = women Child = children Foot = feet Tooth =teeth We can use a **pair of** with some plural nouns: A pair of trousers a pair of shorts a pair of scissors a pair of glasses **Uncountable nouns**

Some nouns are not countable in English:

Milk, rice, water, cheese, meat, time, money, hair

These nouns do not usually have a plural form:

We can use words like these with uncountable nouns:

A packet of, a jar of, a piece of, a glass of, a cup of, a box of

You can count these:

A packet of biscuits, two jars of jam, three pieces of paper, a glass of juice, a cup of coffee, two boxes of chocolates

The noun money is uncountable: How much money do you have?
